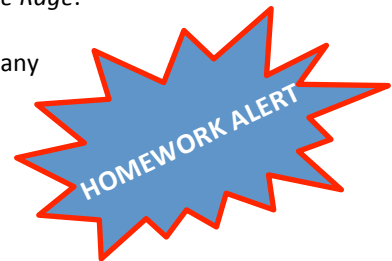

Worship: Kim lit the chalice with a reading. Dick shared a spiritual practice by Tara Brach, "Mindfulness Meditation." Jann closed with a prayer.

Jann encouraged the Justice League to lead by becoming active in volunteer roles, not just giving money. We will have the opportunity to do this during our next Service Sunday on January 28.

Interfaith Alliance Report: Dick attended a recent meeting and reported that the meeting was good; Kenny was a presenter. An important take-away was that "racist people create racist institutions. We need to focus on changing racist institutions." A source for the presentations was the book, *All the Rage*.

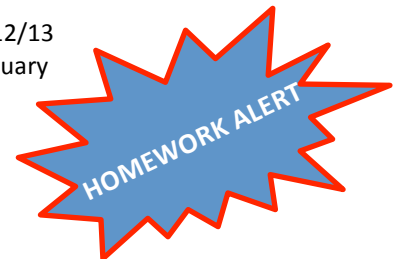
Action Planning

- **Involving youth in justice activities:** There is a strong desire to engage the youth of Prairie in justice activities. There have been efforts to involve youth by Joe and Susan E. The focus on animals was a suggestion of the youth. It is important to communicate that we listened to the youth suggestion and want to involve them more. It was suggested that we have a youth representative on the Justice League committee, add content to their classes, and have a lead person from our group to work with the youth. Maurice and Timothy were suggested. Kim agreed to reach out to the youth and encourage their involvement and ask for suggestions about a representative from their group.
- **ICI follow-up meeting on Saturday, December 16, 2017:** Several members of Prairie are planning to attend a meeting at Jefferson UU in Golden on the 16th of December. This is a follow-up to an earlier meeting, but folks can attend this meeting even if they did not attend the first. Registration is required (Kim sent link). Kim encouraged members to attend so that Prairie has strong representation.

- **Voter Registration/Suppression:** We still hope for a class on the topic will be offered in a future learning hour, to be led by Isaac and friend. Additionally, Vivian will follow up with the League of Women Voters on their efforts to prevent voter suppression and perhaps invite them to present to us in the Spring.
